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CONSENT FOR PUPILLARY DILATION

At Modern Eyewear Optometry, our comprehensive eye examination includes pupillary dilation. This involves putting drops in the eyes that dilate the pupils for the doctor to examine the inside of the eye. This allows the doctor to diagnose ocular disease such as cataracts, glaucoma, macular degeneration, and retinal detachment. There are some side effects to these drops, such as blurred vision at near distances (arms length or closer) for approximately 2-4 hours and sensitivity to light. Most patients suffer no loss of distance vision and are able to drive afterwards, however some people feel more comfortable bringing a driver with them.

Less than 1 in 40,000 patients suffer serious side effects from dilation drops. The symptoms are usually eye pain, intense headache, cloudy vision and/or nausea within a few hours of the drops. If you experience any of these symptoms call us immediately.

The contact lens assessment is the evaluation of the health of the eye, tear film, and fit of the contact lens for new and current contact lens wearers. This assessment is in addition to the visual health examination and warrants an additional professional fee. This is a mandatory fee for all contact lens wearers.

Fee for services: \$50 to \$125 (depending on contact lens type and fitting difficulty). Speciality fittings for corneal disease and corneal molding therapy have higher fees which will be discussed prior to treatment.
